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

Shares & Proportions

- 70% of all young people (15-34), irrespective of their labour market status, are unemployed, of whom *close to a third* are those aged 15-24
- In pure numerical terms, the problem of unemployment in South Africa is the problem of youth unemployment
- While the numbers are much higher, this strong youth dimension to unemployment is a global phenomenon


Key Markers of Youth Unemployment

- Race, Gender and Location remain the key determinants or predictors of unemployment generally
- This is no different for young people
- The most disadvantaged individual in the labour market thus is likely to be a young, African, female living in a rural area
- The inertia in unemployment is also very clear: Strong Structural dimension
- Note: that across most of these covariates unemployment rates have increased since 1994 [Does *not* mean jobless growth]


Unemployment Rates by Education

Unemployed Youth & Education

- Overall manifest in a skills mismatch, with characteristics of workers not meeting labour demand needs
- Within this, there are problems of:
 - Quality of schooling together with quality & content of Matric Passes
 - Early School Leavers: Problems in FET System
 - Incorrect/inappropriate fields of study
 - Malfunctioning labour market information system
 - Insufficient communication between firms and Institutions of Human Capital
